#### WHAT IS THE CERTIFICATE?

This distinctive certificate is designed to provide Transitional Kindergarten teachers with expertise to create and design effective learning environments, curriculum, and instruction that are developmentally, culturally, and linguistically appropriate for young learners. The Transitional Kindergarten Teaching Certificate, offered by CEEL, consists of a three-course program of study with a combination of real-time webinars and online sessions. This program expands the knowledge, skills, and dispositions of credentialed multiple subject educators.

#### HOW MANY CLASSES ARE REQUIRED?

Successful completion of three, four (4) unit courses with a grade of "B" or better is required to earn the Certificate. Participants can earn a total of up to 12 continuing education units.

#### WHAT IS THE COST PER COURSE?

LAUSD Participants: \$410.00 (Scholarship Rate for LAUSD schools only)

All Other Participants: \$496.00

(Total of 3 courses = \$1,488 to complete certificate. No additional charges apply.)

#### HOW DO I ENROLL?
