As an educator, Bernadette is a dedicated advocate for hands-on, personalized, whole child-centered learning. In the world of early childhood in the Oakland Unified School District, Bernadette was a founding dual immersion Transitional Kindergarten (TK) teacher.

Bernadette has taken her passion and drive for supporting the earliest learners and taken it outside of the walls of T, into an adult setting, focusing on Bay Area Preschool, TK and Kindergarten teachers. In addition to being a literacy specialist and Preschool/ TK professional development provider with SEEDS of Early Learning, she currently works also as an Adjunct Professor of Early Childhood at Chabot College in Hayward, and a SEEDS coach. She has presented at a national education conference on research focusing on dual language immersion in early education, and she continues to research new, effective ways to support home language as an asset.

Bernadette's drive and determination for early education and transformational change has led her to pursue humanizing education in early education while working on her doctorate at Mills College.
